Menstrual hygiene refers to the practices and products that individuals use to manage	

			menstruation in a safe, healthy, and dignified way. It includes maintaining cleanliness during menstruation, using appropriate menstrual products, and understanding reproductive health. The event was organized under CSR initiative "My Menstruation My Pride". CSR has been undertaking menstrual hygiene among school & college girls covering almost 2000+ schools & colleges and 1,00,000 beneficiaries at pan India level.
