**GDC R.S. PURA STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN EDUCATIONAL FIELD VISIT TO GHARANA WETLAND**

The students of Government Degree College, R.S. Pura participated in an educational field visit to Gharana Wetland as part of the celebrations of Wetlands Month and the International Day of Clean Energy. The visit was organized by the Department of Environmental Sciences in collaboration with Department of Ecology, Environment & Remote Sensing (DEEERS) Government of Jammu & Kashmir, under the Environmental Information, Awareness, Capacity Building and Livelihood Programme (EIACP) of the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change (MoEFCC). A total of 40 students took part in the programme with the objective of enhancing environmental awareness and promoting experiential learning related to wetland ecosystems. During the visit, students were delivered an expert lecture by Sh. 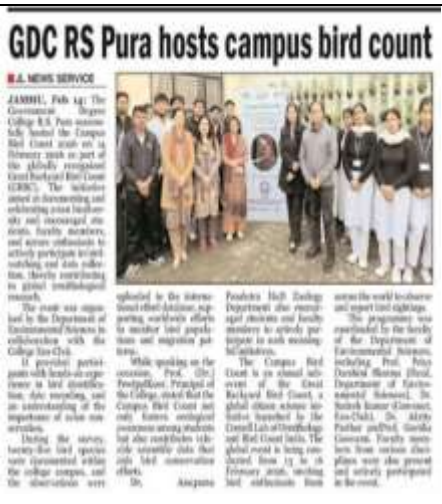
