

# THE JAMMU AND KASHMIR RESERVATION RULES, 2005

Social Welfare Department Notification SRO-294  
dated 21<sup>st</sup> October, 2005

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 23 of the Jammu and Kashmir Reservation Act, 2004, section 22 of J&K Persons with Disabilities Act, 1998 and all other relevant provisions of the law in this behalf, the Government hereby makes the following rules :-

**1. Short title and commencement.** - (1) These rules may be called the Jammu and Kashmir Reservation Rules, 2005.

<sup>1</sup>[(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Government Gazette].

**2. Definitions.** - In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires,-

- (i) "Act" mean the Jammu and Kashmir Reservation Act, 2004;
- (ii) "Annexure" mean the Annexure to these rules;
- (iii) "Areas adjoining the Actual Line of Control" mean the areas declared as such vide SRO-394 dated 5-9-1981 read with notification SRO-272 dated 3-7-1982 and SRO 271 dated 22-8-1988 as amended from time to time, forming **Annexure – "A"** to these rules;
- (iv) "Available seats" means seats against which admissions are to be made in respect of a course in professional institutions, as hereinafter defined;
- (v) "Backward Area" mean the villages/areas declared as socially and educationally backward vide SRO-394 dated 5-9-1981 read with notification SRO:272 dated 3-7- 1982 and SRO-271 dated 22-8-1988 as amended from time to time, forming **Annexure – "B"** to these rules;
- (vi) "Candidates possessing outstanding proficiency in sports" mean a sports person as defined under the Jammu and Kashmir Certification of Outstanding Proficiency in Sports Rules, 1996, as amended from time to time, forming **Annexure-"C"** to these rules;
- (vii) "Children" mean the direct descendents but shall not include grandchildren;
- (viii) "Children of Defence Personnel" mean the children of those Permanent Residents of the State who are serving in Army, Navy or Air Force or having served as such and had been

**PART -IV**

**13. Reservation in Professional Institutions.** - Except as hereinafter provided, seats shall be reserved for Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Socially and Educationally Backward Classes in each course of professional institutions which shall, as nearly as possible, constitute such a percentage of the available seats in that course as shown against each category or group hereinafter: -

(i)	<b>Scheduled Castes</b>	8%
(ii)	<b>Scheduled Tribes</b>	
	(a) Gujjars and Bakerwals	6%
	(b) Residents of District Leh	2%
	(c) Residents of District Kargil	2%
	(d) Other than (a), (b) and (c) above	1%

	(a) Weak and Under Privileged Classes (Social Castes)	2%

**14. Other reservation.** - In addition to the reservations specified in rule 13, the following reservation is also made in favour of the following categories of the permanent Residents of the State to the extent shown against each: -

(a)	Children of Defence Personal	3%
(b)	Children of Para-military Forces and State	1%

Police personnel

- (c) Candidates possessing outstanding proficiency in sports 2%

**15. Distribution of seats.** - For the post-graduate courses in MD/MS/M.Tech, Engineering and Agricultural Sciences and similar other postgraduate courses, the seats shall be distributed as follows with the condition that the selection of candidates from the reserved categories for different streams shall be made strictly on the basis of their inter-se merit, treating them as a single class for purpose of allotment of streams: -

**Explanation: -** The rural service means service rendered in the areas at least 20Kms away from municipal limits from the shortest possible route:

**16. Qualifying Marks.** - The minimum qualifying marks in the entrance examination for selection in the courses mentioned in rule 14 and 15 shall be as follows: -

**17. Allotment of discipline etc.** - A reserved category candidate, if selected against the Open Merit seat, may be considered for allotment of discipline/stream/college allocable to him in his respective category on the basis of his merit and preference. The resultant discipline/stream/college in the Open Merit category shall be allotted to the reserved category candidate who gets selected consequent upon the reserved category candidate getting selected in the Open Merit Category.

#### PROCEDURE FOR ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES

**18. Competent Authority to issue certificate.** - The following officers shall be the Competent Authority to issue certificates under these rules: -

**Subject:- Implementation of Reservation Policy of the Government in Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges and other Grant-in-Aid.**

The undersigned is directed to refer Commissioner Secretary to Government, General Administration Department to his No. GAD/Mtg/RB-IV/86/2016 dated 12-04-2017 regarding the subject cited above and to inform that the University in J&K are governed by UGC norms. UGC has issued the detail guidelines in 2006 & directed their implementation vide letter No. F.1-5/2006(SCT) dated 05-03-2018 and No. F.1-5/2006(SCT) dated 20-04-2018. The State of J&K has own Reservation Act which was passed by the State Legislature in the year of 2006 and for effecting implementation SRO-294 of 2005 issued by Social Welfare Department in the year 2005 read with SRO-144 of 2008 dated 28-05-2008. The norms of UGC reproduced as under:-

- I.** All the Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges and other Grant-in-Aid institutions hereby directed to adopt these guidelines by appropriate resolution by the respective Governing/Executive Bodies/Syndicate/Senate etc for effective implementation of these guidelines (section-5 of Guidelines 2006, page-2).

**II. Coverage and Applicability**

- a). Reservation is applicable to all the teaching posts such as the posts of Lecturers, Readers, Professors, or by whatever other nomenclature the posts are known, and to all posts of non-teaching staff of all the Universities, Deemed to be Universities, Colleges, and other grant-in-aid or research institutions. (section-6 Sub (a) of Guidelines 2006, page-2).
- b). Reservation is also applicable to all admissions to Undergraduate, postgraduate, M. Phil and Ph. D courses of educational institutions. (section-6 Sub (b) of Guidelines 2006, page-2).

- c). The instructions issued by the Central government for grouping of posts shall be resorted to wherever is applicable especially when more than one University functions under a single Act, or several colleges function under one University; grouping of posts are mandatory if the posts concerned are transferable on an inter-university or inter-college levels. The practice of creating department-wise cadres, which tends to create single posts or cadres with artificially reduced number of posts in order to avoid reservation, is strictly forbidden (section-6 Sub (c) of Guidelines 2006, page-2).;
- d). The instructions issued by the Central Government with regard to reservation for implementing Article 16 (4) of the Constitution of India are strictly applicable to all central or any other special quota, permitted under any existing rules all the educational Institutions referred to in clause (a) above, shall also apply to admissions of candidates to those Institutions (section-6 Sub (d) of Guidelines 2006, page-2)..
- e). Relaxation & concession in respect of educational qualification, age, experience and qualifying marks/standard etc will be as per existing government rules in all cases of admission, recruitments, appointments, promotions and other assignments of entitlements to the members of SC/ST (section-6 Sub (e) of Guidelines 2006, page-2).

**III.** i). The Roster, 40-point or 100 point as the case may be shall be applied to the total number of posts in cadre only (R. K. Sabharwal vs State of Punjab, (AIR 1995 SC 1371); cadre is best indicated by seniority list governing the members with the same pay-scale (section-8 Sub (v) of Guidelines 2006, page-3).;

ii). Total number of vacancies shall be calculated and Roster as referred above shall be applied only excluding the back-log vacancies, if any (section-8 Sub (vi) of Guidelines 2006, page-3);

iii). Percentage of reservation shall be applied separately for each recruitment year and not whenever the vacancies arise, or interviews take place, or recruitment/appointment is made (section-8 Sub (vii) of Guidelines 2006, page-3).

**IV. Procedure to be followed in matters of reservation for admission**

- i). No SC/ST students can seek admission or claim reservation, unless he/she appears in national or State/common or University/Institution test held for the purpose, in order to

avail the quota of seats reserved for them, by the educational institutions (section-9 Sub (i) of Guidelines 2006, page-3).

- ii). In cases, where National or Common/State or University/institution test is not prescribed as necessary for selecting candidates for admission, the SC/ST candidates seeking admissions, shall be arranged in the order of merit among themselves, as per the merit position obtained in the qualifying examination (section-9 Sub (ii) of Guidelines 2006, page-3).
- iii). Rules of interchangeability among SC-s and ST-s are applicable, wherever necessary to fill-up the number of vacant seats (section-9 Sub (v) of Guidelines 2006, page-4);
- iv). In case no eligible reserved candidates are available, the vacant seats in the reserved quota shall not be filled by any non SC/ST candidates. Every efforts shall be made to re-advertise for wider publicity in the leading local/national news papers (section-9 Sub (v) of Guidelines 2006, page-4).
- v). Advance special (short terms) coaching with assistance from UGC may be introduced for prospective SC/ST students (section-9 Sub (vii) of Guidelines 2006, page-4).

#### **V. Admission to Hostel Accommodations**

- i). The percentage of reservation referred above under the head "percentage" shall be strictly observed for admission to the hostels. Additional percentage of seats may be provided for the girls students of these communities. No rent shall be changed from the students of these communities (section-11 of Guidelines 2006, page-4).
- ii). The percentage of reservation for Staff Quarters, transit Houses, teacher's hostels etc shall be commensurate with the quantum of reservation as prescribed (section-12 of Guidelines 2006, page-5).
- iii). Each University/Institutions shall appoint a liaison Officers, who is not below the rank of a Deputy Secretary of the concerned State or Central Government and will be responsible for monitoring the implementation of reservation under these Rules (section-13 of Guidelines 2006, page-5).
- iv). All the Universities/Institutions shall establish an SC/ST Cell in order to process the grievances of the members of these communities, the SC/ST Cell Shall function under the overall

supervision of the Liaison Officer (section-14 of Guidelines 2006, page-5).

**VI. Amendments to existing University Acts and Statutes**

- i). Action should be initiated by the Universities so as to effect necessary amendments to their Acts/Statutes for the statutory support for reservation in admission, appointments to teaching and non-teaching posts and representation of SC/ST in their bodies like syndicate Executive Council, Academic Council; , Selection Committee etc (section-16 of Guidelines 2006, page-5).
- ii). The above Policy guidelines are minimum prescribed for observation of the reservation policy for SC/ST. The University/institutions are free to provide additional benefits to these categories with the approval of their Board of Governors/Executive Council etc (section-17 of Guidelines 2006, page-5).

**VII.** Moreover, the University Grants Commission has filed affidavit in the Hon'ble High Court at Jammu in SWP No. 3553 of 2016 titled Ashish Bhardwaj Vs University of Kashmir & Ors (copy enclosed) wherein stated that:-

- i). University Grants Commission is an autonomous statutory body under the administrative control of ministry of human resources development, as such, is under the direction from the Central Government. It is apt to mention here that the Central Government has been issuing various instructions from time to time for the implementation of reservation policy.
- ii). The Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Indira Sahani V/s Union of India & Ors (AIR 1993 SC 447) as held that the instructions issued by the government for the implementation of reservation issued by the government for the implementation of reservation policy are statutory in nature as these instructions are issued for the purposes of implementing constitutional provision Art 16(4).
- iii). All the educational institutions i.e. Universities, deemed to be Universities, Colleges and other granting aid or research institutions or centres functioning within any state shall follow the percentage of reservation prescribed by the respective State Governments.
- iv). It is mandatory for all the Educational institutions i.e. Universities, deemed to be universities, Colleges and other granting aid or research institutions or centres to submit reports about the implementation of the guidelines issued for the implementation of reservation policy annually by 15<sup>th</sup> of Feb and the reports so submitted shall be taken into account by University Grants Commission to readjust or reduce the extend of demand for the grant-in-aid for the following



academic year in proportion to the deficiency in implementation of the guidelines to implement reservation policy.

- v). The answering respondents vide No. F.7-8/2015(SCT) its letter dated 4<sup>th</sup> of May 2017 the answering respondent has directed the University of Kashmir to adopt reservation policy for SC/ST circulated by the UGC in 2006 immediately if not done earlier. It has been further directed that the backlog of reservation in teaching and non-teaching posts is required to be filled up.

**VIII Further,** the University Grants Commission vide letter No. F.7-8/2015(SCT) dated 06-07-2017 addressed to Vice-Chancellor, University of Kashmir wherein has stated that as per the statement send by yours University, the University has not filled up any post by SC/ST/OBC and PWD candidates, which shows that the reservation is not being adopted by your University. According to UGC Act, 1956, the UGC has to ensure effective implementation of the reservation policy in the Central/State and Deemed to be Universities and those institutions receiving aid from the Public funds except in Minority Institutions under Article 30(1) of the constitution. The University is required to adopt reservation policy for SC/ST as per the State Government norms immediately, if not done earlier. It is also to mention that non implementation of Reservation Policy by University, may invite stern action by UGC.

As the University is governed by University Grants Commission (UGC) Guidelines, all the University authority directed to implement the UGC guidelines in letter & sprit.
